26	3. On or about May 21, 1969, the Medi	cal Board of California issued Physician's and
27	Surgeon's Certificate No. C31188 to Respondent	. The Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate was
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in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 03-2012-221148 and will expire on December 31, 2013, unless renewed.

### **JURISDICTION**

4. Accusation No. 03-2012-221148 was filed before the Medical Board of California (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on October 2, 2012. Respondent filed a Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 03-2012-221148 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

# ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 03-2012-221148. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

#### **CULPABILITY**

8. Respondent admits the truth of the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 03-2012-221148, agrees that these admissions could establish a factual basis for the discipline set forth in this Stipulation, and hereby surrenders his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C31188 for the Board's formal acceptance.

9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further process.

## **CONTINGENCY**

- 10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Medical Board of California. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Medical Board of California may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect and, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 11. The parties understand and agree that facsimile or electronic copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including facsimile or electronic signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 12. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

# **ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C31188, issued to Respondent Byron William Kilgore, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Medical Board of California.

1. The surrender of Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Medical Board of California.

- 2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Physician and Surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 4. If he ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California, Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 03-2012-221148 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.
- 5. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 03-2012-221148 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

#### **ACCEPTANCE**

I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully discussed it with my attorney, Brock Phillips. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Medical Board of California.

<u>JURISDICTION</u>

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Medical Board of California (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
  - 4. Section 2004 of the Code states, in relevant part:
  - "The board shall have the responsibility for the following:
- "(a) The enforcement of the disciplinary and criminal provisions of the Medical Practice

  Act.
  - "(b) The administration and hearing of disciplinary actions.
- "(c) Carrying out disciplinary actions appropriate to findings made by a panel or an administrative law judge.
- "(d) Suspending, revoking, or otherwise limiting certificates after the conclusion of disciplinary actions.
- "(e) Reviewing the quality of medical practice carried out by physician and surgeon certificate holders under the jurisdiction of the board."
- 5. Section 2227 of the Code provides that a licensee who is found guilty under the Medical Practice Act may have his or her license revoked, suspended for a period not to exceed one year, placed on probation and required to pay the costs of probation monitoring, or such other action taken in relation to discipline as the Division deems proper.
  - 6. Section 2234 of the Code states, in relevant part:
- "The Division of Medical Quality shall take action against any licensee who is charged with unprofessional conduct. In addition to other provisions of this article, unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:
- "(a) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate any provision of this chapter [Chapter 5, the Medical Practice Act].
  - "(b) Gross negligence."

7. Section 726 of the Code states in pertinent part:

"The commission of any act of sexual abuse, misconduct, or relations with a patient, client, or customer constitutes unprofessional conduct and grounds for disciplinary action for any person licensed under this division, under any initiative act referred to in this division and under Chapter 17 (commencing with Section 9000) of Division 3."

- 8. Section 729 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that any physician and surgeon or psychotherapist, who engages in any act of sexual intercourse or sexual contact with a patient is guilty of sexual exploitation.
- 9. The American Psychiatric Association's Principles of Medical Ethics with Annotations Especially Applicable to Psychiatry (2009 Revision) provides, in the annotations to Section 2 as follows:

"The requirement that the physician conduct himself/herself with propriety in his or her profession and in all the actions of his or her life is especially important in the case of the psychiatrist because the patient tends to model his or her behavior after that of his or her psychiatrist by identification. Further, the necessary intensity of the treatment relationship may tend to activate sexual and other needs and fantasies on the part of both patient and psychiatrist, while weakening the objectivity necessary for control. Additionally, the inherent inequality in the doctor-patient relationship may lead to exploitation of the patient. Sexual activity with a current or former patient is unethical." (Emphasis added.)

# FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Sexual Misconduct)

- 10. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under Code section 726 and/or 729 in that he engaged in a sexual relationship with a patient. The circumstances are as follows:
- 11. In or around February 2012, the Board received a complaint from M.V.<sup>2</sup> who alleged that Respondent, her psychiatrist, had engaged in sexual misconduct with her.
- 12. M.V. first saw Respondent for psychiatric treatment in or around 1974, and continued to receive psychiatric treatment from Respondent intermittently at various time intervals,

including between 2001 and 2009. M.V. reported a history of physical and verbal abuse from her father and, as a result, being susceptible to feelings of rejection.

- 13. In or about 2008, patient's treatment sessions with Respondent became more flirtatious, and Respondent would sometimes hug her at the end of their sessions.
- 14. In or about May 2009, Respondent engaged in a sexual encounter, including sexual intercourse, with the patient at a hotel close to his office. They went to dinner afterwards at a nearby restaurant. Over the next several weeks, Respondent and the patient engaged in two or three further sexual encounters at Respondent's office. Their sexual relationship then ended, and the patient stopped seeing Respondent for psychiatric treatment.
- 15. The patient reported developing severe bouts of depression and feelings of low self-worth as a result of her sexual encounters with Respondent.
  - 16. The patient began seeing a new psychiatrist in or about November 2009.

# SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Gross Negligence)

- 17. Paragraphs 11 through 16 are incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth.
- 18. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under section Code section 2234(b) in that he engaged in a sexual relationship with a patient which is an extreme departure from the standard of care.

#### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number C31188, issued to Byron William Kilgore, M.D.;
- 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Byron William Kilgore, M.D.'s authority to supervise physician assistants, pursuant to section 3527 of the Code;
- 3. Ordering Byron William Kilgore, M.D., if placed on probation, to pay the Medical Board of California the costs of probation monitoring; and
