CEASE PRACTICE ORDER

In the Medical Board of California (Board) Case No. 08-2012-225501, the Board issued a Decision adopting a Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, which became effective April 24, 2015. In the Board's Order, Physician's and Surgeon's License No. A 102651, issued to Shiquan Xiong, M.D., was placed on 3 years' probation.

Probationary Condition No. 6, Clinical Training Program, states that within 60 calendar days of the effective date of this Decision, Respondent shall enroll in a clinical training or educational program equivalent to the Physician Assessment and Clinical Education Program (PACE) offered at the University of San Diego California – San Diego School of Medicine ("Program"). Respondent shall successfully complete the Program not later than one (1) year after Respondent's initial enrollment unless the Board or its designee agrees in writing to an extension of that time.

If Respondent fails to enroll, participate in, or successfully complete the clinical training program within the designated time period, Respondent shall receive a notification from the Board or its designee to cease the practice of medicine within three (3) calendar days after being so notified. The Respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until enrollment or participation in the outstanding portions of the clinical training program have been completed. If Respondent did not successfully complete the clinical training program, the Respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until a final decision has been rendered on the accusation and/or a petition to revoke probation. The cessation of practice shall not apply to the reduction of the probationary time period.

A condition of Phase I of PACE required Respondent to submit to a neuropsychological evaluation, which showed Respondent was not fit for duty as a psychiatrist and physician. Therefore, the Respondent has failed to successfully comply with Probationary Condition No. 6 as ordered in the above Decision, by failing to successfully pass PACE. Accordingly, Respondent, Shiquan Xiong, M.D., is prohibited

from engaging in the practice of medicine. The Respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until a final decision has been issued on an accusation and/or a petition to revoke probation filed pursuant to this matter.
