INTERIM ORDER SUSPENDING LICENSE PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 11529

## TO JEFFREY THOMAS GRAY, M.D. AND HIS ATTORNEY

## JOHN KENNEDY:

The Medical Quality Hearing Panel of the Office of Administrative Hearings, having read and considered the Petition of Interim Order, the supporting Memorandum of Points and Authorities, and the Declarations and exhibits submitted by the Attorney General on behalf of Petitioner David Thornton, Executive Director, Medical Board of California, and the Opposition and supporting Memorandum of Points and Authorities and attached Declaration filed by counsel for Dr. Gray, and having heard and considered oral argument by both parties at the noticed hearing of the Petition, and good cause appearing,

HEREBY ORDERS that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 56251, issued to Jeffrey T. Gray, M.D., be immediately suspended. Pending the hearing and determination of the allegations presented by an accusation against Dr. Gray, he is hereby immediately restrained and prohibited from

- (a) Practicing or attempting to practice as a physician and surgeon;
- (b) Possessing, prescribing, dispensing, furnishing, administering, or otherwise distributing any controlled substance or any dangerous drug;
- (c) Possessing or holding his physician's and surgeon's wall and wallet certificates, any and all prescription blanks, Drug Enforcement Administration Drug Order Forms, and any and all Drug Enforcement Administration permits, which documents shall be surrendered by him to the Medical Board pending adjudication of this matter;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Jeffrey Thomas Gray, M.D. shall, upon demand, turn over to the Medical Board for safekeeping all prescription blanks in his possession or under his custody or control.

Pursuant to the provisions of Government Code section 11529(f), if an accusation against Dr. Gray is not filed and served pursuant to Government Code sections 11503 and 11505 within 15 days of the date of this Order, the Order shall dissolve.
