CEASE PRACTICE ORDER

In the Medical Board of California (Board) Case No. 800-2017-030868, the Board issued a Decision adopting a Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, which became effective November 13, 2020. In the Board's Order, Physician's and Surgeon's License No. G 42267, issued to Mark Stephen Wagner, M.D., was ordered revoked, the revocation was stayed, and Respondent placed on probation for three (3) years with terms and conditions.

Probationary Condition No. 5 – Monitoring – Practice, requires Respondent, within sixty (60) days of the resignation or unavailability of the monitor, to obtain approval of a replacement monitor. If Respondent fails to obtain approval of a replacement monitor within sixty (60) days of the resignation or unavailability of the monitor, Respondent shall receive notification from the Board or its designee to cease the practice of medicine within three (3) calendar days after being so notified. Respondent shall cease the practice of medicine until a replacement monitor is approved and assumes monitoring responsibility.

Respondent has failed to obey Probationary Condition No. 5 as ordered in the above Decision, by failing to obtain approval of a replacement monitor within 60 calendar days of the practice monitor's unavailability. Accordingly, Respondent, Mark Stephen Wagner, M.D., is prohibited from engaging in the practice of medicine. Respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until a replacement monitor is approved and assumes monitoring responsibility.
