FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the BOARD OF MEDICINE (Board) pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes, on December 1, 2006, in Orlando, Florida, for consideration of the Administrative Complaint (attached hereto as Exhibit A) in the above-styled cause pursuant to Respondent's Election of Rights. At the hearing, Petitioner was represented by Robert Swanson, Assistant General Counsel. Respondent was present and represented by Gregory Chaires, Esquire. The facts are not in dispute.

Upon consideration, it is ORDERED:

1. ~~The allegations of fact~~ set forth in the Administrative Complaint are approved and adopted and incorporated herein by reference as ~~the findings of fact~~ by the Board.

2. The conclusions of law alleged and set forth in the ~~Administrative Complaint~~ are approved and adopted and incorporated herein by reference as the conclusions of law by the Board.

3. The violations set forth warrant disciplinary action by the Board.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:

1. Respondent shall pay an administrative fine in the amount of \$1,000 to the Board within 30 days from the date this Final Order is filed.

2. Respondent shall document completion of the Laws and Rules course sponsored by the Florida Medical Association (FMA) within one year from the date this Final Order is filed.

3. Within one (1) year from the date this Final Order is filed, Respondent shall document the completion of 50 hours of community service. Community service shall be provided without fee or cost to the person or entity benefitting from the service, for the good of the people of the State of Florida. A community service plan must be pre-approved by the Board's Probationer's Committee. Affidavits detailing the completion of community service requirements shall be filed with the Board's Probationer's Committee.

RULING ON MOTION TO ASSESS COSTS



ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

COMES NOW Petitioner, Department of Health, by and through undersigned counsel, and files this Administrative Complaint before the Board of Medicine against Respondent, Stephen E. Nadeau, M.D., and alleges:

1. Petitioner is the state agency charged with regulating the practice of medicine pursuant to Section 20.43, Florida Statutes; Chapter 456, Florida Statutes; and Chapter 458, Florida Statutes.

2. At all times material hereto, Respondent has been a duly licensed physician in the State of Florida, having been issued license number ME 33898.

3. Respondent's address of record is GRECC (182), Veterans Administration Medical Center, Gainesville, Florida, 32608-1197

4. Respondent is board certified in neurology.

5. Respondent was Patient S.R.'s treating neurologist from 1991 to 2001. Respondent saw Patient S.R. for treatment of migraine headaches and depression.

6. Respondent's last office visit with Patient S.R., a then forty-six year old female, was in or about October 2001.

7. In or about November 2001, Patient S.R. moved from the State of Florida to the State of Colorado.

8. On or about November 27, 2002, Respondent dictated a letter to Patient S.R.'s chart which stated Respondent had called in a prescription for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets for Patient S.R. after speaking with Patient S.R. by telephone.

9. Fiorinal #3 is a schedule III controlled substance regulated under Chapter 893 Florida Statutes, which contains aspirin, butalbital, caffeine, and codine. It is used primarily to relieve complex tension headaches. Fiorinal #3 has a currently accepted medical use in treatment in the United States, and abuse of Fiorinal #3 may lead to moderate or low

physical dependence and/or high psychological dependence.

10. On or about December 23, 2002, Patient S.R. contacted Respondent via telephone because of an increase in frequency and change in pattern of her headaches.

11. Respondent wrote a prescription for Methadone 10 mg, 180 tablets and called in a prescription for Fiorinal #3, 200 tablets for Patient S.R.

12. Methadone is a schedule II controlled substance regulated by Chapter 893, Florida Statutes. Methadone is a narcotic pain reliever used in the treatment of severe pain. Methadone has a currently accepted medical use in treatment in the United States, and abuse of Methadone may lead to severe psychological and/or physical dependence.

~~13. On or about January 20, 2003, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone to provide follow-up care for her migraines. Respondent issued Patient S.R. one prescription for Methadone 10 mg, 180 tablets and one prescription for Fiorinal #3, 1560 tablets with one refill.~~

14. On or about February 20, 2003, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone and Patient S.R. reported to Respondent that she had destroyed one of the Methadone prescriptions Respondent had mailed to

her. Respondent issued Patient S.R. a prescription for Methadone 10 mg, 180 tablets.

15. On or about March 22, 2003, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headache management, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued, and mailed to Patient S.R., two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 186 tablets, and one prescription for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets with one refill.

16. On or about May 12, 2003, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. one prescription for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets with one refill, and two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 186 tablets.

17. On or about July 11, 2003, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. one prescription for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets with one refill, and mailed Patient S.R. two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 186 tablets.

18. On or about September 3, 2003, Respondent spoke to Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression.



Respondent issued Patient S.R. two prescriptions for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets and two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 186 tablets.

19. On or about October 24, 2003, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 248 tablets and two prescriptions for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets.

20. On or about December 15, 2003, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. two prescriptions for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets and two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 248 tablets.

21. On or about February 9, 2004, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 248 tablets and two prescriptions for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets.

22. On or about April 2, 2004, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 248 tablets and two prescriptions for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets.

23. On or about May 28, 2004, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 248 tablets and two prescriptions for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets.

24. On or about July 20, 2004, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. one prescription for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets with one refill and two prescriptions for Methadone 10 mg, 248 tablets.

25. On or about September 13, 2004, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. regarding her headaches, sleep disorder and depression. Respondent issued Patient S.R. one prescription for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets with one refill and one prescription for Methadone 10 mg, 240 tablets.

26. On or about November 7, 2004, Respondent spoke with Patient S.R. via telephone and was advised by Patient S.R. that she had been hospitalized on a psychiatric service with a diagnosis of bipolar affective disorder and had been treated with lithium. Respondent issued Patient S.R. one prescription for Fiorinal #3, 150 tablets with one refill and one prescription for Methadone 10 mg, 310 tablets.

27. Respondent prescribed narcotic medications and/or controlled substances to Patient S.R. who was residing out-of-state, without performing a physical examination on Patient S.R., for a period of approximately three years.

28. Section 458.331(1)(t), Florida Statutes (2004), provides that gross or repeated malpractice or the failure to practice medicine with that level of care, skill and treatment which is recognized by a reasonably prudent similar physician as being acceptable under similar conditions and circumstances, constitutes grounds for disciplinary action by the Board of Medicine.

29. Respondent failed to practice medicine with that level of care, skill, and treatment which is recognized by a reasonably prudent similar physician as being acceptable under similar circumstances when Respondent continued to prescribe narcotic and/or controlled substance medication to Patient S.R. who was no longer living in the State of Florida, based solely on Respondent's telephone conversations with Patient S.R. and without performing any physical examination on Patient S.R. for a period of approximately three years.

30. Based on the foregoing, Respondent violated Section 458.331(1)(t), Florida Statutes (2004), by failing to practice medicine with that level of care, skill and treatment which is recognized by a reasonably prudent-similar physician as being acceptable under similar conditions and circumstances.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests the Board of Medicine enter an order imposing one or more of the following penalties: permanent revocation or suspension of Respondent's license, restriction of Respondent's practice, imposition of an administrative fine, issuance of a reprimand, placement of Respondent on probation, and/or any other relief that the Board deems appropriate.

**MOTION TO ASSESS COSTS**  
**IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 456.072(4)**

COMES NOW the Department of Health, by and through undersigned counsel, and moves the Board of Medicine for the entry of a Final Order assessing costs against the Respondent for the investigation and prosecution of this case in accordance with Section 456.072(4), Florida Statutes (2003). As grounds therefore, the Petitioner states the following:

1. At its next regularly scheduled meeting, the Board of Medicine will take up for consideration the above-styled disciplinary action and will enter a Final Order therein.

2. Section 456.072(4), Florida Statutes-(2003),<sup>1</sup> states as follows:

<sup>1</sup> Ch. 2003-416, § 19, Laws of Fla., effective September 15, 2003, amended Section 456.072(4), Florida Statutes (2003), to include the underlined language.

In addition to any other discipline imposed through final order, or citation, entered on or after July 1, 2001, pursuant to this section or discipline imposed through final order, or citation, entered on or after July 1, 2001, for a violation of any practice act, the board, or the department when there is not board, shall assess costs related to the investigation and prosecution of the case. Such costs related to the investigation and prosecution include, but are not limited to, salaries and benefits of personnel, costs related to the time spent by the attorney and other personnel working on the case, and any other expenses incurred by the department for the case. The board, or the department when there is no board, shall determine the amount of costs to be assessed after its consideration of an affidavit of itemized costs and any written objections thereto. . . . (emphasis added)

3. The investigation and prosecution of this case has resulted in costs in the total amount of \$3,802.95, based on the following itemized statement of costs:

- a. Total costs for Complaints \$42.95
- b. Total costs for Investigations \$1,170.74
- c. Total costs for Legal \$1,433.01
- d. Total costs for expenses \$1,156.25

Therefore, the Petitioner seeks an assessment of costs against the Respondent in the amount of \$3,802.95, as evidenced in the attached affidavit. (Exhibit A).

4. Should the Respondent file written objections to the assessment of costs, within ten (10) days of the date of this motion,


specifying the grounds for the objections and the specific elements of the costs to which the objections are made, the Petitioner requests that the Board determine the amount of costs to be assessed based upon its consideration of the affidavit attached as Exhibit A and any timely-filed written objections.

5. Petitioner requests that the Board grant this motion and assess costs in the amount of \$3,802.95 as supported by competent, substantial evidence. This assessment of costs is in addition to any other discipline imposed by the Board and is in accordance with Section 456.072(4), Florida Statutes (2003).

WHEREFORE, the Department of Health requests that the Board of Medicine enter a Final Order assessing costs against the Respondent in the amount of \$3,802.95.

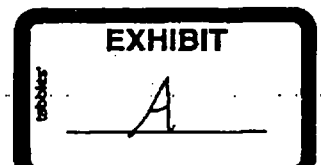

- 1) My name is James R. Cooksey.
- 2) I am over the age of 18, competent to testify, and make this affidavit upon my own personal knowledge and after review of the records at the Florida Department of Health (DOH).
- 3) I am a Operations Management Consultant for the Consumer Services Unit for DOH. The Consumer Services Unit is where all complaints against Florida health care licensees (e.g., medical doctors, dentists, nurses, respiratory therapists) are officially filed. I have been in my current job position for more than one year. My business address is 4052 Bald Cypress Way, Bin C-65, Tallahassee, Florida 32399.
- 4) As a Operations Management Consultant, my job duties include reviewing data in the Time Tracking System and verifying that the amounts correspond. The Time Tracking System is a computer program which records and tracks DOH's costs regarding the investigation and prosecution of cases against Florida health care licensees.
- 5) ~~As of today, DOH's total costs for investigating and prosecuting DOH case number 2004-21769 (Department of Health v. Stephen Nadeau, M.D.), are three thousand eight hundred and two dollars and ninety-five cents (\$3,802.95).~~
- 6) The costs for DOH case number 2004-21769 (Department of Health v. Stephen Nadeau, M.D.) are summarized in Exhibit 1 (Cost Summary Report), which is attached to this document.
- 7) The itemized costs and expenses for DOH case number 2004-21769 (Department of Health v. Stephen Nadeau, M.D.) are detailed in Exhibit 2 (Itemized Cost Report and Itemized Expense Report and receipts), which is attached to this document.
- 8) The itemized costs as reflected in Exhibit 2 are determined by the following method: DOH employees who work on cases daily are to keep track of their time in six-minute increments (e.g., investigators and lawyers). A designated DOH employee in the Consumer Services


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Unit; Legal Department, and in each area office, inputs the time worked and expenses spent into the Time Tracking System. Time and expenses are charged against a state health care Board (e.g., Florida Board of Medicine, Florida Board of Dentistry, Florida Board of Osteopathic Medicine), and/or a case. If no Board or case can be charged, then the time and expenses are charged as administrative time. The hourly rate of each employee is calculated by formulas established by the Department. (See the Itemized Cost Report)



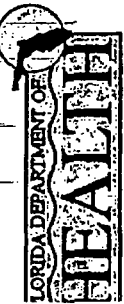
