## CLOSING ORDER

THE COMPLAINT: Complainant alleges that the Subject of the investigation failed to practice medicine with the level of care, skill and treatment found acceptable by a similar reasonable physician by rendering inadequate psychiatric care to the Complainant's daughter.

THE FACTS: Investigation substantiated the allegations in that the Subject did not prescribe medicine to the Complainant's daughter according to the prevailing standard of care. The Complainant took her daughter to see the Subject with a history of bipolar manic depression. The Subject evaluated the patient and recommended lithium therapy. A Department expert opined that the Subject adequately evaluated the patient however, he failed to adequately treat the patient by not prescribing an antidepressant.

THE LAW: Based on the foregoing, there is sufficient evidence to support a finding of probable cause that Subject violated the provisions of Section 458.331(1)(t), Florida Statutes or the rules promulgated thereunder has occurred. However under the circumstances, this will be closed with a Letter of Guidance.

It is, therefore, ORDERED that this matter should be, and the same is hereby CLOSED with a Letter of Guidance. DONE and ORDERED this 33 day of Fernuary
