STATEMENT OF CHARGES and SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT (Combined)

COMES NOW the Iowa Board of Medical Examiners (the Board), and

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

- 1. Respondent was issued Iowa medical license no. 27904 on January 9, 1991.
- 2. Respondent's Iowa medical license is active and will next expire on January 1, 2008.
- 3. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code Chapters 147, 148 and 272C.

COUNT I

4. Respondent is charged pursuant to Iowa Code section 148.6(2)(h) (2007) and 653 IAC sections 23.1(6) with the inability to practice medicine and surgery with reasonable skill and safety due to excessive use of drugs or alcohol.

COUNT II

5. Respondent is charged pursuant to Iowa Code section 147.55(3) (2007) and 653 IAC section 23.1(3) with engaging in unethical or unprofessional conduct or practice harmful or detrimental to the public.

COUNT III

6. Respondent is charged pursuant to Iowa Code section 147.55(2), 148.6(2)(g) and 272C.10(2) (2007), and 653 IAC section 23.1(7) with indiscriminately prescribing, administering or dispensing controlled drugs.

STATEMENT OF THE MATTERS ASSERTED

- 7. Respondent is a psychiatrist who formerly practiced in Mason City, Iowa.
- 8. Previous Disciplinary Action: On October 8, 1998, the Board charged Respondent with professional incompetency and indiscriminately or promiscuously prescribing controlled drugs to a patient without performing an appropriate examination and without maintaining adequate medical records. Respondent was issued a Citation and Warning, ordered to pay a \$1,000 civil penalty and he was required to fully comply with appropriate prescribing practices in the future.
- 9. **New Information:** The Board received information which raises concerns that Respondent is unable to practice medicine and surgery with reasonable skill and safety, including but not limited to the following:
 - A. The Board received information which indicates that Respondent's excessive use of drugs or alcohol impairs his ability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety.
 - B. The Board received information which indicates that Respondent violated appropriate physician-patient boundaries on numerous occasions.
 - C. The Board received information which indicates that Respondent improperly prescribed, administered and/or dispensed controlled drugs.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

- 10. Respondent no longer lives in Iowa and he does not intend to return to Iowa to practice medicine.
- 11. Respondent voluntarily surrenders his Iowa medical license (no. 27904) to resolve this matter.
 - 12. This Order constitutes the resolution of a contested case proceeding.
- 13. By entering into this Order, Respondent voluntarily waives any rights to a contested case hearing on the allegations in the Statement of Charges, and waives any objections to the terms of this Settlement Agreement.

- This Order is voluntarily submitted by Respondent to the Board for 14. consideration.
- 15. This Order is subject to approval of the Board. If the Board fails to approve this Order it shall be of no force or effect to either party.
