
COMPLAINT

NOW COMES the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (Department), by its Chief of Medical Prosecutions, Frank Lamas, and as its COMPLAINT against Blaise Wolfrum, M.D., Respondent, states as follows:

COUNT I

- Respondent is presently the holder of a Certificate of Registration as a Physician and Surgeon in the State of Illinois, License No. 036-079918, issued by the Department. Said license is presently indefinitely suspended.
- 2. On or about October 18, 2017, Respondent's Illinois Physician and Surgeon License was temporarily suspended by the Director of the Division of Professional Regulation based on allegations that Respondent engaged in boundary violations with a minor patient of his psychiatric practice. See Department's Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part of this Complaint.
- 3. On or about June 2, 2018, Respondent's Illinois Physician and Surgeon License was indefinitely suspended by the Director of the Division of Professional Regulation based on allegations of inappropriate controlled substance prescribing for patients of his

- practice as well as his failure to maintain proper boundaries with a minor patient. See Department's Exhibit B, attached hereto and made a part of this Complaint.
- 4. In 2020, the Department received information that Respondent continued to engage in the practice of medicine after his license was suspended.
- 5. Specifically, in October of 2017, Respondent continued to serve as a president of Behavioral Health Care Associates, Ltd. ("BHCA"), located in Schaumburg, Illinois.
- 6. After October 2017, Respondent continued to serve as an owner of BHCA.
- 7. In 2018, Respondent continued to direct and/or delegate other healthcare providers at BHCA, including Michael Rachman, M.D., regarding care and treatment of patients.



- 9. While Respondent's Illinois Physician and Surgeon License has been suspended since October 2017, Respondent continues to provide TMS (transcranial magnetic stimulation) treatments to patients at the practice located in Schaumburg, Illinois.
- 10. TMS therapy is a procedure that uses magnetic fields to stimulate nerve cells in the brain to improve symptoms of depression.
- 11. TMS therapy is typically used when other depression treatments have not been effective.

12. TMS therapy requires direct supervision and oversight by an actively licensed Physician

and Surgeon.

13. The foregoing acts and/or omissions are grounds for revocation or suspension of a

Certificate of Registration pursuant to 225 Illinois Compiled Statutes, Section 60/22 (A),

paragraph (5), relying upon the Rules for the Administration of the Medical Practice Act,

Illinois Administrative Code, Title 68, Chapter VII, Subpart b, Part 1285.240 (a) and

Section 60/22(A)(13).

WHEREFORE, based on the foregoing allegations, the DEPARTMENT OF

FINANCIAL AND PROFESSIONAL REGULATION, DIVISION OF PROFESSIONAL

REGULATION, of the State of Illinois, by Frank Lamas, its Chief of Medical Prosecutions,

prays that the Illinois Physician and Surgeon License of Blaise Wolfrum, M.D., be suspended,

revoked, or otherwise disciplined.
