This matter is before the North Carolina Medical Board (hereinafter Board) regarding the Board's concerns about the medical practice of Charles Robertson Vernon, M.D. (hereinafter Dr. Vernon), holder of license number 9154.

Whereas the Board is concerned that Dr. Vernon has prescribed controlled substances and other drugs without first sufficiently evaluating the need for such prescriptions, or without sufficiently documenting the need for such prescriptions, and

Whereas the Board is concerned that Dr. Vernon has delegated to an unlicensed person acts, tasks, or functions constituting the practice of medicine that are not otherwise permitted by law or established by custom for performance by an unlicensed person, and

Whereas Dr. Vernon admits the above-described conduct is unprofessional conduct within the meaning of N.C. Gen Stat. §90-14(a)(6), and grounds exists under that section of the North Carolina General Statutes for the Board to annul, revoke, suspend, condition or limit Dr. Vernon's license to practice medicine, and

Whereas Dr. Vernon met with the Board on January 19, 1996 to discuss these concerns, and Whereas Dr. Vernon desires to resolve this matter without need for more formal proceedings, and

Whereas Dr. Vernon has taken steps and has agreed to take further steps to ensure the Board and the people of North Carolina that he can safely practice medicine, and

Whereas the Board has determined it to be in the public interest to resolve this matter as set forth below;

Now, therefore, with Dr. Vernon's consent, it is ORDERED that:

- 1. Dr. Vernon is hereby REPRIMANDED.
- Dr. Vernon personally shall examine all new patients and each patient for whom a
  prescription is ordered.
- 3. Dr. Vernon shall personally sign appropriate entries made in the chart of each patient for whom medications are prescribed.
- 4. Dr. Vernon shall not delegate the prescriptions of any medication and shall personally call pharmacies in cases where prescriptions are ordered telephonically.
  - 5. Dr. Vernon shall obey all laws.
- 6. If Dr. Vernon fails to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Order, that failure shall constitute unprofessional conduct and shall be grounds, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(6), after any required notice and hearing, for the Board to annul, suspend, revoke, condition, or limit Dr. Vernon license to practice medicine or to deny any application Dr. Vernon might make or then have pending for a license to practice medicine.
- 7. This Consent Order shall take effect immediately upon its execution by both Dr. Vernon and the Board, and it shall continue in effect until specifically ordered otherwise by the Board.

8. Upon execution by Dr. Vernon and the Board, this Consent Order shall become a							
public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the North Carolina General Statutes and							
shall be subject to public inspection and dissemination pursuant to the provisions thereof.
