



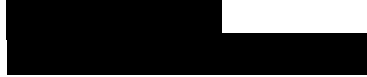

Dear Dr. Palumbo:

The North Carolina Medical Board (“Board”) has concluded its investigation related to the action taken against you by the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy (“Nevada Pharmacy Board”). It is the Board’s decision not to commence formal proceedings against your North Carolina medical license at this time. However, the Board voted to issue you this public letter of concern. The Board does not consider a public letter of concern to be a disciplinary action or a limitation or restriction on your North Carolina medical license.

On September 4, 2024, you entered into a Stipulation and Order with the Nevada Pharmacy Board in which you were placed on probation for one year with conditions, including being publicly reprimanded, assessed a \$2,500.00 fine, and assessed \$1,000.00 in costs. The Nevada Pharmacy Board’s action was based on allegations that you permitted registered nurses to independently access, possess, and administer dangerous drugs, without direct practitioner supervision. The Nevada Pharmacy Board also alleged that you engaged in or aided and abetted others to engage in unprofessional conduct and committed acts that render registration inconsistent with the public interest.

The Board urges you to take steps to ensure the conduct giving rise to the Board’s concerns does not happen again. Otherwise, the Board may take additional action against your North Carolina license to practice medicine. If that happens, this letter may be reviewed in determining the appropriate action.

This public letter of concern is a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the North Carolina General Statutes and is subject to public inspection and dissemination as required by that law. It will be reported to the Federation of State Medical Boards.




