| 9 | The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, |
| 10 | regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the State of |
| 11 | Oregon. Lynn Karl Friedman, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the State of Oregon. |
| 12 | 2. |
| 13 | On May 5, 2022, the Board issued a Second Amended Complaint and Notice of Proposed |
| 14 | Disciplinary Action (Notice) in which the Board proposed to take disciplinary action against |
| 15 | Licensee pursuant to ORS 677.205(2), including: revocation of license; assessment of a civil |
| 16 | penalty of \$10,000; and assessing costs of any contested case hearing on the matter not to exceed |
| 17 | \$80,000. The Board proposed to take this disciplinary action for violations of the Medical |
| 18 | Practice Act, specifically: ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional conduct, as defined in ORS |
| 19 | 677.188(4)(a) any conduct or practice which does or might constitute a danger to the health or |
| 20 | safety of a patient or the public; ORS 677.190(13) repeated acts of negligence in the practice of |
| 21 | medicine; ORS 677.190(13) gross negligence in the practice of medicine; and ORS 677.190(24) |
| 22 | prescribing controlled substances without a legitimate medical purpose, or prescribing controlled |
| 23 | substances without following accepted procedures for examination of patients or without |
| 24 | following accepted procedures for record keeping. |
| 25 | 3. |
| 26 | Licensee and the Board desire to settle this matter by entry of this Stipulated Order. |
| 27 | Licensee understands that she has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative |
| 28 | Procedures Act (chapter 183), Oregon Revised Statutes. Licensee fully and finally waives the |

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| 1 | right to a contested case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of and entry of this |
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| 2 | Order in the Board's records. Licensee neither admits nor denies, but the Board finds that |
| 3 | Licensee's conduct as described in the May 5, 2020, Amended Complaint and Notice of |
| 4 ° | Proposed Disciplinary Action violated ORS 677.190(1)(a), as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a); |
| 5 | ORS 677.190(13); and ORS 677.190(24). Licensee understands that this Order is a public recor |
| 6 | and is a disciplinary action that is reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank and the |
| 7 | Federation of State Medical Boards. |
| 8 | 4. |
| 9 | Licensee and the Board agree to resolve this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order |
| 10 | subject to the following terms and conditions: |
| 11 | 4.1 Licensee is reprimanded. |
| 12 | 4.2 Licensee must pay a civil penalty of \$5,000 within 90 days from the effective date |
| · 13 | of this Order. |
| 14 | 4.3 Within six months of the effective date of this Order, Licensee must complete 30 |
| 15 | hours of Category I CME in diagnostic criteria for and medical management of geriatric mental |
| 16 ., | health that have been preapproved by the Board's Medical Director. |
| 17 | 4.4 Within six months of the effective date of this Order, Licensee must complete a |
| 18 | documentation course that has been preapproved by the Board's Medical Director. |
| · 19 | 4.5 Licensee must, at her own expense, enter into an agreement with a licensed, |
| 20 | board-certified psychiatrist who is pre-approved by the Board's Medical Director to serve as her |
| 21 | practice mentor. Licensee must meet with the approved mentor at least monthly to review |
| 22 | Licensee's full treatment of all patients over age 65 who were seen in the last month. Licensee |
| 23 | must document the treatment plan she develops in coordination with her mentor and adhere to |
| 24 | that plan. The mentor is to provide quarterly written reports to the Board on Licensee's ability to |
| 25 | safely and competently practice medicine with specific reference to appropriate diagnostic |
| 26 | workup, appropriate prescribing with special attention to stimulants and benzodiazepines, and |
| 27 | other areas of educational need identified in the February 2020 CPEP assessment. After four |

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| 1 | quarterly reports, Licensee may request modification of this term with the support and written |
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| 2 | recommendation of her practice mentor. |
| 3 | 4.6 Licensee must adhere to current published standards for appropriate prescribing |
| 4 º | and required monitoring to include risk assessment prior to initiating treatment with opioids, |
| 5 | urine drug screens, PDMP checks, and pain contracts when prescribing opiates, for any and all |
| 6 | controlled substances. |
| 7 | 4.7 At the discretion of the Board or its designees, random, no notice chart audits and |
| 8 | office visits may be conducted by Board designees. |
| 9 | 4.8 Licensee must inform the Compliance Section of the Board of any and all practice |
| 10 | sites, as well as any changes in practice address(es), employment, or practice status within 10 |
| 11 : | business days. Additionally, Licensee must notify the Compliance Section of any changes in |
| 12 | contact information within 10 business days. |
| 13 | 4.9 Licensee must obey all federal and Oregon state laws and regulations pertaining |
| 14 | to the practice of medicine. |
| 15 | 4.10 Licensee stipulates and agrees that any violation of the terms of this Order shall |
| 16 | be grounds for further disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17). |
| 17 | 4.11 Licensee stipulates and agrees that this Order becomes effective the date it is |
| 18 | signed by the Board Chair. |
