AGREED ORDER OF VOLUNTARY SURRENDER

On the 18 day of August, 2023, came on to be heard before the Texas Medical Board (the Board), duly in session, the matter of the license of Wayne Charles Jones, M.D. (Respondent).

Respondent is presently the subject of a Complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH), docket 503-22-08900.MD. The Complaint is the consolidation of two prior actions that were heard at Informal Settlement Conferences on May 13, 2022, and December 14, 2022, respectively.

By Respondent's signature on this Order, Respondent waives the right to appear at further proceedings, including an Informal Show Compliance Proceeding and Settlement Conference pursuant to Section 164.004, Medical Practice Act, Title 3, Subtitle B, Texas Occupations Code and Board Rule 187.18 and all rights pursuant to Sections 2001.051 and 2001.054, Texas Government Code, including but not limited to, the right to notice and hearing. Respondent agrees to the entry of this Order to resolve matters addressed herein. Respondent was represented by counsel, Jon Porter, J.D. Michael Gilmour represented Board staff and prepared this Order.

With the consent of Respondent, the Board makes the following Findings and Conclusions of Law and enters this Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender.

FINDINGS

The Board finds that:

1. Respondent received all notice required by law. All jurisdictional requirements have been satisfied. Respondent waives any defect in notice and any further right to notice or hearing under the Medical Practice Act, Title 3, Subtitle B, Texas Occupations Code (the Act) or the Rules of the Board.

2. Respondent currently holds Texas Medical License No. D6049. Respondent was originally issued this license to practice medicine in Texas on August 27, 1969.

3. Respondent is primarily engaged in psychiatry and clinical pharmacology. Respondent is not currently board certified.

4. Respondent was under investigation for failing to meet the standard of care, failing to keep adequate medical records, and inappropriately prescribing for 11 patients, including himself, and aiding and abetting the unauthorized practice of medicine.

5. Respondent neither admits nor denies the information given above.

6. Respondent has indicated his desire to voluntarily surrender his medical license. By Respondent's signature on this Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender, Respondent requests that this Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender be accepted in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings and be effective on the date of the entry of this Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender.

7. To avoid further investigation, hearings, and the expense and inconvenience of litigation, Respondent agrees to the entry of this Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender and to comply with its terms and conditions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the above Findings, the Board concludes that:

1. The Board has jurisdiction over the subject matter and Respondent pursuant to the Act.

2. Section 164.061 of the Act and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE 196.2 authorizes the Board to accept the voluntary and permanent surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License.

3. This Order is based on Finding No. 4 above and the specific authority of Section 164.051(a)(6) of the Act.

4. Section 164.002(a) of the Act authorizes the Board to resolve and make a disposition of this matter through an agreed order.

ORDER

Based on the above Findings and Conclusions of Law, the Board ORDERS that:

1. The voluntary and permanent surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License D6049 should be, and is, accepted by the Board effective on the date this Order is signed by the President of the Board.

2. Respondent's Texas Medical License D6049 is, therefore, permanently canceled.

3. Respondent shall immediately cease practice in Texas. Respondent's practice in the state of Texas after the date of entry of this Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender shall constitute a violation of this Order, subjecting Respondent to disciplinary action by the Board or prosecution for practicing without a license in Texas.

4. Respondent shall not petition the Board for reinstatement of his Texas license.

5. By this voluntary and permanent surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License, Respondent resolves any and all complaints currently before the Board.

RESPONDENT WAIVES ANY FURTHER HEARINGS OR APPEALS TO THE BOARD OR TO ANY COURT IN REGARD TO ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREED ORDER. RESPONDENT AGREES THAT THIS IS A FINAL ORDER.

THIS ORDER IS A PUBLIC RECORD.

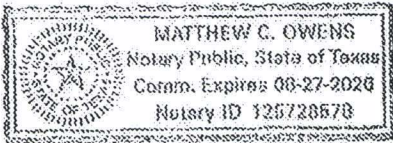


