AGREED ORDER OF VOLUNTARY SURRENDER

On the <u>13</u> day of <u>December</u>, 2024, came on to be heard before the Texas Medical Board (the Board), duly in session, the matter of the license of Ingrid Elisabeth Schmidt, M.D. (Respondent).

By the signature of Respondent on this Order, Respondent waives the right to appear at an Informal Show Compliance Proceeding and Settlement Conference pursuant to Section 164.004, Medical Practices Act, Title 3, Subtitle B, Texas Occupations Code and Board Rule 187.18 and all rights pursuant to Sections 2001.051 and 2001.054, Texas Government Code, including, but not limited to the right to notice and hearing, and instead agrees to the entry of this Order to resolve matters addressed herein. Emily Walker represented Board Staff.

With the consent of Respondent, the Board makes the following Findings and Conclusions of Law and enters this Agreed Order.

FINDINGS

The Board finds that:

- 1. Respondent received all notice required by law. All jurisdictional requirements have been satisfied. Respondent waives any defect in notice and any further right to notice or hearing under the Medical Practice Act, Title 3, Subtitle B, Texas Occupations Code (the Act) or the Rules of the Board.
- 2. Respondent currently holds Texas Medical License No. E4663. Respondent was originally issued this license to practice medicine in Texas on January 1, 1978. Respondent specializes in psychiatry and child and adolescent psychiatry.

- 3. Respondent is under investigation by the Board for issues related to impairment and requesting diversion of medication from a patient.
- 4. Respondent has indicated her desire to surrender her medical license voluntarily and represented that she does not intend to renew her license or practice medicine any further. By executing this Agreed Order, Respondent requests that the voluntary surrender of her Texas medical license be accepted in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings and that the voluntary surrender of her Texas medical license be effective on the date of the entry of this Agreed Order.
- 5. Respondent has cooperated in the investigation of the allegations related to this Agreed Order. Respondent neither admits nor denies the information given above. To avoid further investigation, hearings, and the expense and inconvenience of litigation, Respondent agrees to the entry of this Agreed Order and to comply with its terms and conditions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the above Findings, the Board concludes that:

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction over the subject matter and Respondent pursuant to the Medical Practice Act (the Act).
- 2. Section 164.061 of the Act and 22 Texas Administrative Code § 196.2 authorizes the Board to accept the voluntary surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License.
- 3. This Agreed Order is based on Findings of Fact Nos. 3 and 4 and the specific authority of Sections 164.051(a)(4) and 164.052(a)(4).
- 4. Section 164.002(a) of the Act authorizes the Board to resolve and make a disposition of this matter through an Agreed Order.

ORDER

Based on the above Findings and Conclusions of Law, the Board ORDERS that:

1. The voluntary and permanent surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License No. E4663 should be, and is, accepted by the Board effective on the date that this Agreed Order is signed by the President of the Board.

- 2. Respondent's Texas Medical License No. E4663 is, therefore, permanently canceled.
- 3. Respondent shall comply with Board Rule 165.5(d) regarding the required notification to her patients of her discontinuance of practice within 30 days of the effective date of this Agreed Order.
- 4. Respondent shall immediately cease practice in Texas. Respondent's practice of medicine after the date of entry of this Agreed Order constitutes a violation of the Order subjecting Respondent to disciplinary action by the Board or prosecution for practicing without a license in Texas.
 - 5. Respondent shall not petition the Board for reinstatement of her Texas license.
- 6. By this voluntary surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License, Respondent resolves any complaints currently before the Board.

RESPONDENT WAIVES ANY FURTHER HEARINGS OR APPEALS TO THE BOARD OR TO ANY COURT WITH RESPECT TO ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREED ORDER. RESPONDENT AGREES THAT THIS IS A FINAL ORDER.


