BEFORE THE TEXAS STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS

ORDER

On this the <u>28th</u> day of <u>July</u>, 1989, came on to be heard before the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners (the "Board"), duly in session, the matter of David William Coghe, M.D., who appeared at the offices of the Board at 1101 Camino La Costa, Suite 201, Austin, Texas, with Richard Levy, his legal counsel, before a panel of the Board composed of Ms. Linda Kagy and Luis M. Rios, M.D., district review committee members, to discuss in an informal settlement conference several concerns of the Board. The parties agree that all jurisdictional requirements have been satisfied.

Evidence was presented by Dr. Coghe and by the Board relevant to the allegations. The panel finds that because of the irreconcilable differences of facts and circumstances which are not susceptible to resolution in this forum, that there is a legitimate need for a psychiatric evaluation of Dr. Coghe.

THEREFORE, IT IS ACCORDINGLY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that David William Coghe, M.D., shall:

- (a) submit himself for psychiatric evaluation to a qualified 1. psychiatrist mutually acceptable to the licensee and the Executive Director of the Board; (b) follow the recommendations regarding continuing care and treatment, if any be recommended, by such psychiatrist; (c) submit in writing to the Executive Director, of the Board the name of three (3) American Board Certified psychiatrists for approval and when such approval is received, to expeditiously submit himself for evaluation and treatment; (d) furnish a copy of this order to the psychiatrist as proof of the licensee's authorization for the said physician to make reports to the Board regarding the licensee's psychiatric evaluation and such other reports as the Board may request; and understand that the licensee's failure to cooperate with either the psychiatrist mutually agreed upon or with the staff of the Board shall constitute a violation of this order and shall subject the licensee to such sanctions by the Board as the law provides.
- 2. cooperate with the Board, its attorneys, investigators,

compliance officers, and other employees, to verify that he has complied and is in compliance with this Board Order;

- 3. advise the Board of any change of address, mailing or office, within (10) days of such occurrence;
- or conditions are herein assessed shall not include any periods of time during which Respondent either resides or practices medicine outside the state of Texas. If Respondent leaves Texas to live or practice medicine elsewhere, he shall immediately notify the Board of the dates of his departure from and subsequent return to Texas. Upon Respondent's return to Texas, the time period tolled by his departure shall continue until its expiration or termination by the Board;
- Revised Civil Statutes Annotated, and other statutes regulating the practice of medicine, as is required by law for physicians licensed by the Board. For the violation of this Order or Article 4495b, Texas Revised Civil Statutes Annotated, he could be cited to appear before the Board in a formal disciplinary hearing for such violations which could result in cancellation of his license to practice medicine;
- 6. this Order is to be in effect until all requirements have been complied with.
