Dear Dr. Spector:

The Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") received information indicating that you violated certain laws and/or regulations governing the practice of osteopathic medicine. Based on the information considered, and having determined that your practice poses a substantial danger to the public health and safety, the Board voted to summarily suspend your license to practice osteopathic medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia pending a hearing. Enclosed is the Order of Summary Suspension. Effective immediately, it shall be unlawful for you to practice osteopathic medicine or hold yourself out as a licensed physician in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

NOTICE OF FORMAL ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING AND STATEMENT OF ALLEGATIONS

You are hereby notified that a formal hearing has been scheduled before the Board of Medicine ("Board") regarding your license to practice osteopathic medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

TYPE OF PROCEEDING:	This is a formal administrative hearing before a panel of the Board.

LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION:

- 1. This formal hearing related to Paul Mitchell Spector, D.O. ("Respondent"), is being held pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11). This proceeding will be convened as a public meeting pursuant to Virginia Code § 2.2-3700.
- 2. At the conclusion of the proceeding, the Board is authorized to take any of the following actions:
 - Dismiss the case and exonerate you;
 - Reprimand you;
 - Require you to pay a monetary penalty;
 - Place you on probation and/or under terms and conditions;
 - · Continue your license on suspension; or
 - Revoke your license.

STATEMENT OF ALLEGATIONS

The Board alleges that:

1. Dr. Spector is in violation of Virginia Code § 54.1-2915(A)(4), (13), and (14) in that he is

unsafe to practice medicine due to illness, as detailed below.

a. Based on ongoing concerns that Dr. Spector, age 77, was experiencing cognitive

difficulties, on July 27, 2024, Physician 1 accompanied Dr. Spector for blood work and magnetic

resonance imaging ("MRI") of his brain.

f. Physician 1 stated that Dr. Spector specializes in chronic pain management and

psychopharmacology. Individual 1, Dr. Spector's office manager, indicated that Dr. Spector sees an

average of 6 patients a day; however, recently it "has slowed down to three or four patients" a day.

Individual 1 estimated that Dr. Spector has one hundred (100) active patients. Some patients are seen

monthly or quarterly and long-term psychiatric patients are seen for yearly follow-ups.

g. Individual 1 told the investigator that she has had concerns related to Dr. Spector's

patient care and behavior for about 1 ½ years, although she has grown increasingly worried over the last

8 months. Moreover, Individual 1 reported that Dr. Spector is incapable of properly providing

prescriptions in that he provides only "paper" prescriptions when they must be sent electronically, and

that Dr. Spector provided prescriptions and early refills for "abusable" drugs to several patients with

known substance abuse issues, some of whom had also failed drug screens. According to Individual 1,

these "drug seeking" patients know that Dr. Spector is vulnerable and manipulate him to get prescriptions.

i. Patient A was being treated by Dr. Spector for pain associated with Lupus.

According to Individual 1, Patient A "talks circles around Dr. Spector and he gets confused." Historically,

Patient A was prescribed 240 tablets of 15mg oxycodone (C-II) over a 30-day period (to be taken up to

120mg/day). However, on August 9, 2024, Dr. Spector increased the prescription to 360 tablets of 15mg

oxycodone over a 30-day period (to be taken up to 180mg/day). According to Pharmacist 1, the

prescription for 360 tablets was received on a weekend. Pharmacist 1 was unable to reach Dr. Spector

until the following week. Pharmacist 1 asked why the oxycodone was increased to 360 tablets and Dr.

Spector denied sending it. While still on the phone with Dr. Spector, Pharmacist 1 faxed him a copy of

the prescription and Dr. Spector abruptly hung up. Dr. Spector called back and again denied writing the

prescription. According to Pharmacist 1, Dr. Spector accessed Patient A's PMP and stated that he had not

provided the previous prescriptions for oxycodone either. Pharmacist 1 communicated to Dr. Spector that

the pharmacy would not fill Patient A's prescription² nor any other prescriptions for oxycodone written

by him. Pharmacist 1 stated Dr. Spector replied that is a "good idea." Pharmacist 1 later told the

investigator that "I am very concerned that [Dr. Spector] is a danger to the public if he doesn't remember

writing prescriptions."

ii. On August 19, 2024, Dr. Spector prescribed Patient B, 30 tablets of 30mg Adderall

(C-II) over a 30-day period. According to Individual 1, Dr. Spector was aware that Patient B was a known

drug seeker and has tested positive for multiple substances on her routine drug tests. Patient B reached

Dr. Spector on his cell phone and manipulated him into prescribing 30 tablets of 30mg Vyvanse (C-II)

over a 30-day period, on August 23, 2024, 4 days later. Records indicate that both prescriptions were

filled.

² Records indicate that Patient A was able to have the prescription filled at a different pharmacy.

h. Individual 1 told the investigator that recently Dr. Spector indicated that he saw

someone in their waiting room that was not actually there. Further, Dr. Spector stated that an ex-employee

was working from home when in fact this employee had resigned 4 months prior. Lastly, Individual 1

added that Dr. Spector makes "an effort to seem like everything is fine" and that if "you didn't know him,

you might think he is perfectly fine."

i. Dr. Spector's diagnoses of neurodegenerative disorder, not otherwise specified,

unilateral; adjustment reaction with paranoia 2/2 neurodegenerative disorder; fatigue; impaired

insight/anosognosia; and aprosodia, and his lack of insight regarding his ability to safely practice medicine

are a danger to patients and the public.

Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2400.2(K), the Board considered whether to disclose or not

disclose Dr. Spector's health records or health services.
